In July and August, we are scheduling 1.5-day trips on the *Voyager*, with overnight trips in September and October.

You may now purchase your 2019 California resident Sport fishing License on line by going to www.ca.wildlifelicense.com website, and click on the On line Fishing License Sale button. The 2019 license will cost \$49.94 plus \$5.66 for the ocean enhancement stamp for a total of \$55.60. An additional 5% is added to the cost when you purchase your license from a local sporting goods dealer.







OHA 2018 Fishing Summary

- **February 20-22, 1.5-day trip on the** *Pacific Voyager***.** The weather window provided us with a good trip for the 18 anglers on board. We fished way south, catching limits of quality rockfish for everyone on board. The jackpot was won by guest Steve Ford with a 25-pound yellowtail. It was a good trip, we saw 3 whales, a rainbow & a great sunset. **18 on trip, 2 guests**
- April 25, ¾ day local trip of the *Pacific Voyager*. The weather was good, but the fishing was poor for the 17 anglers on this trip. We fished north perhaps a dozen spots along the Torrey Pines and Del Mar Coast but could only catch about 85 small rockfish. The jackpot was wan by Bob White was a small 4 lb. Bocaccio. Everyone worked well together on a tough day and we still had a good time. 17 on trip, 1 guest
- May 17, ¾ trip on the *Pacific Voyager*. The weather was poor & we had a 90-mile rough water cruise catching only 1 trolled Bonita & no bait fish. Capt. Mark fished north-west, outside, then south to about 10 miles west of the Islands looking for schools of Yellowtail with no luck. This is the first trip since I have been here that we gave back the jackpot money. The highlight of the trip was dinner at Old Town Mexican Café. 20 on trip, 1 guest
- June 10-12 two-day trip on the *Pacific Voyager* to the Coronado Islands. Good weather and fishing. Caught 44 Yellowtail the first day & 28 the second day. We also caught limits of large Calico bass, and Barracuda. Fred Campbell caught a 100-pound Black Sea Bass, the fish of a lifetime. Jackpots won by Bob White the first day with an 18-pound Yellowtail, and guest Wayne Berg the second day with a 10-pound Yellowtail. It was a fun trip, and everyone caught a bunch of nice fish. 16 on trip, 4 guests
- July 15-17, 1.5-day trip on the *Voyager*. Wow what a trip! Good weather, 16 on trip, fished off-shore around the 43-fathom bank. We fished 25 or 30 schools if breaking tuna that would not bite. We caught 13 BFT up to 50 lbs. & 4 YFT. In the late afternoon Captain Todd ran further off-shore to fish for big BFT on a 200 lb. slow trolled gummy flyer flying fish kite rig. The first fish hooked and landed was a big BFT that taped out at 240 pounds. The kite was put out again. The second hook up was even larger, and after a 3-hour fight was landed & taped out at 298 pounds. The biggest fish that we have ever caught! Everyone went home with a large chuck of BFT. The jackpot was won by guest Aki Shinoda with a 49-pound Bluefin. 16 on trip, 4 guests
- August 5-7, 1.5-day trip on the *Voyager*. Good trip, nice weather, calm seas, 16 on boat. Fishing OK, Good Yellowtail fishing on off-shore kelp paddies, Yellowfin, Dorado & a few Skipjack. Jackpot won by guest Steve Campbell with 17-pound Yellowtail. We caught 76 Yellowtail, 14 YFT, 9 Dorado, 6 Skipjack. 16 on trip, 6 guests
- September 13/14 overnight trip on the *Voyager*. Good off-shore trip with 16 on board. Fished outside the Islands in the 302 area for 70 YFT, and too many Skipjack. Jackpot won by guest Steve Ford with 18-pound YFT. Weather good, calm seas, everyone had good time. 16 on trip, 3 guests
- October 11/12 overnight trip on the *Voyager*. Quite a trip, went 75 miles Southwest in search of Yellowfin, Yellowtail & Dorado. Caught 56 Yellowfin Tuna, 32 Yellowtail, 11 Dorado & 12 Skipjack, releasing many more Skipjack. Most fish were small school size tuna and yellowtail, with Fred Campbell catching a nice 15 lb. jackpot Dorado. Capt. Todd and crew worked hard to catch us some fish in tough conditions with building seas in north wind. Long trip north coming home in rough conditions with some rain and lightning. Everyone worked together and helped each other, and no one got hurt. Returned to Seaforth at 9:30 PM after a long day. Pretty good way to end the year. 16 on trip, 3 guests

2018 was another good year for the Southern California landings. Here are the total sportfishing catch from all landings.
